EZEKIEL PUTMAN

Hall County to Bartow County Georgia

Ezekiel Putman is the youngest son of Barnet and Sarah Putman, being born probably in Union County, South Carolina in the early 1770s. In the 1790 census Barnet is listed with 2 males under 16 and 5 females; I have no idea as to exactly who these folks were. It is possible that Ezekiel and Laban were still living at home with their father in 1790. I have not yet discovered the names of any of Barnet's daughters.

I have a letter written by Reding Putman, 2nd, to William Cobb of Elkins, West Virginia dated on June 14, 1912. In this letter, a request for details of family history, Reding writes, "*Laban Putman was a brother of grandfather, Daniel Putman. Ezekiel who married Hannah Braselton was the son of Laban.*" I have another letter from Cobb dated 1911 where he firmly believes Ezekiel and Laban were brothers. I agree on the brother relationship as their ages seem to be within a few years of each other based on census data. Also, Reding was vague on other facts. He stated he was not certain if his father ever was in Indiana. This and other bits of Reding's writings lead me to believe that he was not a great historian.

At any rate, Ezekiel married Hannah Brazelton in 1800 in Anderson, South Carolina. Hannah was the daughter of Jacob Brazelton and Hannah Green of Granville County, North Carolina. According to William Cobb, she was born on June 24, 1781 in North Carolina. However, her cemetery inscription in the Hopewell Baptist Church Cemetery reads she was born March 20, 1783 and died May 20, 1833. Jacob's father, John Brazelton, was an immigrant from Wales who settled first in Frederick County, Maryland in 1740 and then moved to North Carolina. For those interested, I have a rather complete genealogy of the Brazelton family in another one of my books, The *Canaday Family History*.

I am not certain where he and Hannah were married, but they appeared in the 1800-1810 Census in the Pendleton District of South Carolina. At that time they had one son, probably Elias, under the age of 10 years. This census was taken about 1805.

In the early 1800s, Ezekiel moved with other members of his family to Warren County, Kentucky. On November 8, 1808 he obtained some 200 acres of land near his family in the Bowling Green area of south central Kentucky. Ezekiel is listed in the 1810 census of Kentucky as living with his wife in Warren County. At that time they had 4 sons and 2 daughters under the ages of 10 years.

Ezekiel was in Kentucky in August 1817, when he signed a voucher for \$2.36 due him from his father's estate from his brother Daniel who was the administrator of Barnet Putman's estate. Two of Daniel's sons, Hazeal and Reding, had returned to Kentucky to settle a land affair and had the voucher signed at the time; it was later recorded in the Gibson County, Indiana Courthouse.

In the letters of William Cobb, who was a descendent of Ezekiel and a native of Georgia, he mentions that his father, who married Ezekiel's daughter Rebecca, told him his mother was partially raised in Kentucky though born in Georgia. And that Ezekiel Putman came to Georgia first in 1812 and moved back to Kentucky twice before making Georgia his permanent home.

Sometime in 1817, Ezekiel moved his family to Hall County, Georgia for the final time. This time, his brother, Thomas and his family went with them. There is a deed dated October 17, 1808 (I believe this is a typo and 1818 would be the correct year as Hall County was formed out of Jackson County in the year 1818) listed in Thomas Putman's book showing Ezekiel purchased land in Hall County. Other deeds show Ezekiel deeded lands to his sons, Elias in 1822 and Daniel in 1828.

Hannah died in 1833 and was buried in the Hopewell Baptist Church Cemetery in Cass County, Georgia. Cass County's name was changed to Bartow County in 1861. The records show that Ezekiel was married a second time to Sarah Hesterly on June 9, 1835. According to William Cobb, Ezekiel spent the rest of his life in Georgia and died there in 1845.

In 1840, the family is in Cass County, Georgia. Ezekiel died about 1845. I do not find Sarah listed in 1850. She either died or remarried before 1850 I would guess.

In 1860 there is a Sarah Patman, then 57, listed as a widow in the census of Floyd County, Georgia. She was surrounded by three Patman families, who must have been her children. She is still in Floyd County in 1870 and lists her age as 72. I tracked the families and they were always listed as Patmans and not at all connected to this Putman family. I initially thought she was Sarah Hesterly but she wasn't.

The probable family of Ezekiel and Hannah Putman included the following children. Some of this information was supplied by descendants. The rest I am putting together based on census records from Georgia.

Elias Putman

Elias Putman was born about 1801. One researcher says he married a woman named Faith. I find his wife listed as Libby (born 1813 in North Carolina) in the 1850 census. I believe her name was Arletha Faith Libby, as that is what she used in 1880.

They are in Hall County then in Cherokee County by 1840 probably for the Gold Rush that had just started.

In 1850 they were in Floyd County, Georgia. They are in Gordon County in 1860, and he is listed as insane. In 1870 several of the children are in Gordon County. I assume both Elias and Arletha died sometime in the 1860s.

The children I have are mostly taken from the census reports.

JANE PUTMAN was born in 1825.

ELIJAH COVINGTON PUTMAN was born November 19, 1826 and was married in Floyd County in 1849 to Mary Ellen Dodd who was only 14 years old at the time. Her parents were John Dodd and Charlotte Earle from Floyd County. Elijah was a blacksmith. Mary died about 1858, and he married Malinda White. She was born in Floyd County. Elijah and Malinda had nine children. Elijah died in Pike County, Arkansas on February 18, 1895. Malinda died there as well in 1895. Both buried in the Pleasant Grove, Arkansas Cemetery. There is much more on this family in the section on ARKANSAS PUTMANS. The children were:

Hannah Minnie Putman born in 1849. She would be the first child in the marriage with Mary Ellen. She and the next four kids were born in Georgia. In 1860 she is living with a Mary Ann Burns (same age as her mother would have been) in Rome, Floyd County. She then pops up with John and Rebecca in 1870 with her grandparents, John and Charlotte Dodd.

John Ezekiel Putman born February 6, 1851. In 1860 and 1870, he and his sister Rebecca will be with their grandparents, the Dodds. See the MISSOURI PUTMANS Section.

William H. Putman born December 18, 1852. He married Louisa J. Reynolds and they are living with his parents in 1870.

Mary Ellen Putman born in 1854 and died by 1860.

Rebecca Putman born October 22, 1854. She will be with her grandparents in 1860 and 1870. She married Roland Lumpkin Horton December 13, 1874.

Malinda Putman born and died in the later 1850s. She is the first child in the second marriage. From here on the children are with Malinda and all were born in Arkansas.

Sarah Carolina Putman born July 16, 1860.

Nancy Ann Putman born December 16, 1861.

Richard Thompson Putman born January 31, 1866.

Minnie Edora Putman born in September 1868.

Daniel Elijah Putman born February 12, 1870.

James Bissel Putman born January 25, 1872.

Lucinda Caroline Putman born in December 1874.

Robert Hayes Putman born in October 1878.

Victor Middleton Putman born January 24, 1881.

WILLIAM M. PUTMAN was born in 1828. In 1870 he is in Gordon County, Georgia with his wife Mary. The marriage records of Cass County show he married Mary M. Moran on October 23, 1856. There is another record that on the same date he married Mary M. Mason in Bartow County. I am not certain which is correct. In 1880 he is in Butte County California with his wife Mary and two children. The children were:

Catherine Putman born in Georgia in 1856.

Charles W. Putman born in Georgia in November 1866. He is in Butte County, California in 1910 and 1920 with a wife Matilda Kloss born in California. At the time the children listed were:

Oral (Orvel) Putman born December 1892.

Charles Monroe Putman born June 7, 1894.

Bonita (Merle in 1920) Putman born July 1896.

Margaret Putman born in 1903.

Burton Putman born in California in 1879. He is with Charles in 1900. He is married to a Matilda from Pennsylvania in Santa Barbara County in 1920 and Los Angeles County in 1930.

MANERVA PUTMAN born in 1829.

LEAH PUTMAN born in 1834.

ELIZABETH PUTMAN born in 1836.

POSEY M. PUTMAN born in 1843. He is in Gordon County, Georgia in 1860 with his new wife Martha E. Carpenter. He served in the Confederate Army. There is a war record

stating Posey M. Putman died of wounds in Winchester, Virginia on September 20, 1864. They had these children. They were in Gordon County in 1870 and all out in Pope County Arkansas by 1880.

Savannah Putman born in 1858. She married William Keener in Pope County Arkansas September 25, 1873.

Jacob B. Putman born in October 1859. He was with his sisters in Pope County Arkansas in 1880. He married Alice Hichcox or Hitchcock there September 15, 1881. They are there in Galla Rock, Pope County in 1900. They will move to Indianola, Indian Territory, Oklahoma and he will die there on August 16, 1901.

Mary Putman born in 1862. She was with her sister in Pope County in 1880 and I lose her after that.

REBECCA PUTMAN born in 1844.

SAVIRA PUTMAN born in 1845. She will marry a cousin, Berry E. Putman, on November 8, 1867. Berry is a son of Thomas Putman and Lucinda Hurt. Thomas is her father Elias' brother.

SARAH PUTMAN born in 1846. She is with her brother Elias in Cooke County, Texas in 1880 and 1900. She never married.

ELIAS B. PUTMAN was born March 14, 1853 and died February 23, 1918. He was in Cooke County, Texas in 1880 and in 1900. In both census reports he had his sister with him. There is a marriage record that he finally married, at age 49, to Lena or Leona G. Smith in Cooke County in 1901. Lena was born August 14, 1878 and died March 20, 1958. They are buried in Hibbit Cemetery in Cooke County. Based on census records, their kids were:

Edward Putman born in 1902.

James Bailey Putman born January 10, 1905 and died in Amarillo, Potter County Texas June 18, 1981. He married Loucile Militia Liedtke in 1929. Loucile was born April 28, 1908 and died in Amarillo Monday August 5, 2002.

Haskel B. Putman born in 1909.

Byron C. Putman born in 1915.

ECONOMY PUTMAN was born in 1849. In 1850 she was listed as a male, in 1860 as a female, which I think is correct. She is then married or off somewhere by 1870.

PALESTINE PUTMAN was born in 1855. She married John Brown Purvine in Grayson County, Texas on September 29, 1871. They moved to Carter County, Oklahoma where both are buried. Their children were:

Ernest C. Purvine born in Texas August 16, 1872 and died in Ardmore, Oklahoma

Adria Purvine born in Cooke County Texas about 1873.

Minnie Mae Purvine born May 13, 1876 in Texas, and died in Ardmore, Oklahoma March 12, 1959. She married Perry Lavon Elliott Dexter.

Polk Purvine born February 24, 1880 and died December 28, 1932.

T. C. Purvine born July 3, 1885 and died in Ardmore, Oklahoma December 21, 1897.

Gertrude Purvine born in 1888 and died in 1956. She married Tom Echols. They lived in Ardmore.

Gladys Purvine born July 6, 1893 and died in Ardmore, Oklahoma October 15, 1981. She married William Edward St. John. In the 1920 census of Carter County, Oklahoma,

her mother Palie was living with her.

MARTHA PUTMAN was born in 1856.

Daniel Putman

Daniel Putman was born about April 1, 1802. He married Nancy McConnell in Hall County on September 8, 1825. They lived in Cherokee County, Georgia at the time of the 1850 census through 1870. Nancy was born September 4, 1805, and died August 3, 1879, and in 1880 Daniel is living with his son James and is 78 at the time. He died January 19, 1888. Both are buried in the Landmark Baptist Church in Holly Springs, Cherokee County Georgia along with his son James.

They had the following children:

MARTHA PUTMAN, born in 1829 and married to Thomas J. Buchanan on August 1, 1852. In 1870, two of her children, Nancy and Thomas Buchanan are living with her parents.

MARY PUTMAN was born in 1831. She married Thomas D. Perkinson on November 6, 1851.

HENRY M. PUTMAN was born in October 1833. In 1870 he is in Cobb County with a wife named Mary Ann and a son Charles 1 year old. In 1880 and 1900 he is in Cobb County, Georgia with a wife named Della and three children:

Charles Henry Putman born in 1869. He married Hattie Tynor in Mitchell County on September 12, 1888, and was widowed in Sumter County, Georgia in 1900 with three daughters. He was alone with the kids in Ben Hill County in 1910. He was alone in Atlanta in 1920, and then married Louise Huffman there in 1924. They were in Atlanta in 1930. The daughters all by Hattie were:

Mary L. Putman born in 1892. She is at home in 1910 and gone by 1920.

Annie L. Putman born in 1893. She is single in 1920 living with her sister Ruth in Atlanta.

Ruth M. Putman born in 1898. In 1920 she is in Atlanta married to Welch H. Hooper.

Clara Putman born in 1872.

Della Putman born in 1875.

Rosa C. Putman born in March 1881.

Grace M. Putman born in September 1886.

WILLIAM D. PUTMAN was born in 1836. He served as a first sergeant from July 9, 1861 till November 20, 1861 when he was made 2nd Lieutenant. He was wounded at the Battle of Fredericksburg, Virginia on December 13, 1862 and died the following day.

JOANNA PUTMAN was born December 18, 1838 and died in Holly Springs, Georgia June 5, 1898. She married William Thomas McCollum. He was born March 23, 1835 and died January 9, 1927. He served in the Georgia Calvary from 1862 till the end of the Civil War. He was a farmer and a blacksmith. Their children were:

John Worth McCollum born October 29, 1857 in Canton, Georgia.
Marie Elizabeth McCollum born in 1860.
Henry Putnam McCollum born in 1862.
Nora Lee McCollum born in 1868.
Nancy A. McCollum born in 1872.
Martha Viola McCollum born in 1877.
Jesse O. McCollum born February 17, 1881 and died April 4, 1887 (grave marker).

HOWARD BRAZELTON PUTMAN was born in 1841. He enlisted in the Cherokee Rangers on July 9, 1861 and was made Sergeant on November 1, 1863. He served until the end of the War and surrendered at Appomattox, Virginia on April 9, 1865. In 1870 he is living with a Boger family in Cherokee County, Georgia. Also in 1870, he is married to Sophronia Manly and is living in Upseur County, Texas. In 1880 they are in Hopkins County, Texas. I do not find them in 1900. In 1910 and 1920, he and Sophronia are living with their daughter Maggie in Hopkins County. Howard will die February 2, 1923. Sophronia is widowed here in 1930, and will die herself on February 5, 1933. The children were:

Maggie B. Putman born in Texas in 1870. She married Dozier Thornton and was in Hopkins County through 1920. The children in those reports were:

Emmet Thornton born in 1895. Not in the 1920 census.

Laura Thornton born in 1897. In 1920 she was married to Robin J. Perkins.

Rose Thornton born in 1904.

Morris Thornton born in 1906.

Julia L. Putman born in Texas in 1872. She is widowed with her brother Howard in 1930.

Andrew Lee Putman born in 1875. He is married to an Ada in Jones County Texas in 1910 and in Hale County in 1920 and 1930.

Charles Worth Putman born October 4, 1877. His wife was Margaret. They are in Sulphur Springs Hopkins County in 1910 through the 1930 at least.

Howard Manley Putman born September 12, 1882. He was still single in 1930, but later married. His wife was Josephine.

JOHN BANKS PUTMAN was born March 10, 1844. He served in the C.S.A. as a private from July 9, 1861. He was wounded at Fredericksburg on December 13, 1862. He fought through the rest of the War and surrendered at Appomattox, Virginia on April 9, 1865 with Lee's forces. In 1870 he is in Cherokee County with a wife named Mary Ann and a daughter. In 1880 he is in Callahan County, Texas with these children. He will die in Volusia County Florida February 8, 1888 and be buried there.

Jennie Putman born in 1867 GA.

Howard G. Putman born in 1872 GA. In 1910 through 1930 or longer he is single and has a fruit farm in Volusia County Florida.

John L. Putman born in January 1874 TX. He married Anna Dillard, born October 1874, and was in Caldwell County, Texas in 1900 with these children:

Mary Putman born in November 1895.

Ethel Putman born in February 1898.

Daniel H. Putman born in 1878 TX.

JAMES WORTH PUTMAN was born July 8, 1847 and died March 7, 1916. In 1880 and 1900, he is in Cherokee County with a wife named Sarah. She was born September 20, 1858 and died December 12, 1920. His dad is with him at age 78. In 1910 they are in Cherokee

County but in 1920, Sarah is a widow, age 68, living with her son William. They are all buried at the Landmark Baptist Church in Holly Springs, Cherokee County. The children, all born in Georgia, listed were:

William Daniel Putman born in August 1871. He is in Cherokee County in 1910 through 1930 with his wife Agnes C. Poor and these children. He married Agnes here December 7, 1902. Will died in Holly Springs September 15, 1953 at age 82. Agnes was born in 1878 and died at age 88 on April 24, 1967.

James W. Putman born October 19, 1903 and died May 12, 1984. Based on a tombstone of an infant son born and died July 2, 1942, James' wife was named Era.

William Paul Putman born in 1909. He married Leavy Howell on March 23, 1935 in Cherokee County.

Kathryn Ruth Putman born in 1912.

Henry Lee Putman born February 24, 1919 and died February 17, 1920.

Harold D. Putman born June 17, 1921. He married Annie Lois Bailey in Cherokee County on May 9, 1942. He died in Cherokee County July 8, 1990. Annie was born May 22, 1923, and was alive when Harold died.

James H. Putman born in 1873 and died of pneumonia in 1886.

Henry Putman born in April 1875. He has a farm in Volusia County Florida in 1900. He is single then.

Nancy Putman born March 28, 1879 and died September 8, 1895..

John W. Putman born in June 1882. He married Edith Tumlin in Cherokee County Georgia on December 27, 1905. They were there in 1910 and he ran a general store then. In 1920 and 1930 he is in Birmingham, Alabama with Edith and:

Ruby Putman born in 1909 but missing in 1920.

John H. Putman born in Georgia in 1910.

Clyde Putman born in Texas in June 1885. He is with his brother Henry in Florida in 1900.

Lynn Putman a son born June 30, 1886. He is with his mom and William in 1920 and 1930. He died in Holly Springs September 18, 1947 at age 61.

John C. Putman born in Georgia in May 1888. He is with his brother Henry in Florida in 1900.

Lecy J. Putman born in November 1895. She is with her brother William in 1910 and 1920.

NANCY PUTMAN was born in December 1849 and married a Phillips.

Sarah Putman

Sarah Putman was born about 1803. She married James McConnell in Hall County on December 11, 1823. I have nothing more.

Rebecca Putman

Rebecca was born March 9, 1804 and she married Henry Basil Cobb in Hall County on November 18, 1824. Henry was born December 6, 1801. He was the eldest son of William Cobb and Mourning Garrison.

They lived in Hopewell, Hall County, Georgia and are buried there in the Baptist Cemetery.

Rebecca died January 7, 1879 and Henry died December 27, 1880.

Their children were:

JOHN COBB born December 25, 1825 and died September 16, 1907. He married Christina Adeline Tanner May 12, 1850. Christina was born June 30, 1833 and she died December 28, 1922. They had 12 children:

Elijah T. Cobb born May 2, 1851 and died about 1854.

Rebecca Elizabeth Cobb born October 31, 1852 and died October 26, 1928. She married John H. Doss on November 16, 1873.

David Tanner Cobb born August 29, 1855 and died May 7, 1901. He married Flora Eugenia Merritt April 22, 1883.

Nancy A. Cobb born January 23, 1857 and died in infancy.

William Henry Cobb born June 30, 1859. He married Laone Hutton October 6, 1876.

John V. Cobb born April 19, 1861 and died July 29, 1862.

Joseph Dan Cobb born May 19, 1863. He married Elizabeth Mitchell December 14, 1890.

Thomas J. Cobb born August 29 1865 and died December 14, 1958. He married Alma Addington on October 28, 1888.

Moses Reeves Cobb born August 29, 1868 and died in September 1937. He married Julia Smith on December 25, 1898.

Charles Washington Cobb born February 25, 1870 and died April 3, 1924. He married Dolah McNeil on January 27, 1895.

Mary Alice Cobb born April 17, 1872 and died June 13, 1958. She married Homer Dayton Thompson on August 7, 1892.

Edward Cobb born February 26, 1875. He married Evie Bennett on April 12, 1905.

RICHARD V. COBB born August 8, 1837 and died November 28, 1906. He married Mary Acker. He was a Lieutenant in Company D of the Georgia Infantry and was wounded at Sharpsburg, Maryland.

WILLIAM DANIEL COBB born May 30, 1842. He was a Sergeant in the Gainesville Light Infantry and died at the Battle of Manassas on October 19, 1862.

Jacob Putman

Jacob was born March 13, 1810 in Hall County. He married Sarah H. Johnston in Hall County on February 28, 1833. Sarah was born December 21, 1816 and died at age 36 on October 8, 1853.

He and his family were in Walker County, Georgia in the 1840 census along with Sarah and the eldest three of the below listed children. In the 1850 census of DeKalb County, Alabama, he is shown with Sarah and more children. In 1860 he is in Pike County, Arkansas, widowed with only Clinton at home.

Jacob and his family must have moved after Sarah died in 1853, as John was born while they still lived in Georgia.

In 1860 they are in Mountain township, Pike County, Arkansas with only Clinton, 14, at home. Richard, now 11 is living next door with the Patton family including Narcissa who married some

J. Putman. Elijah Covington Putman is also nearby.

Now, getting back to Narcissa Patton. Various documents refer to her as the widow of J. Putman and one refers to her as the widow of Jacob Putman. If she married a Jacob Putman, then it might have been this Jacob. I am not certain as all Pike County records were destroyed in fires. Another researcher states that Narcissa had a child out of wedlock and that may be the case with her here. She may just have been a sort of 'Common Law Wife'. It would appear if this was the case then she had the son Richard Putman by Jacob and out of wedlock. It does appear that Richard was her son.

A relative has a few pages of a letter written in 1861 from Jacob to his son Joseph. Here is what he was able to decipher:

Ark. March 26th 1861

Dear Jo

I write to you again we are all well & doing very well considering the hardship of times though such times I never saw before. They has been hardly anything made for the past 2 years but I have plenty and keep rising I hear said the most of those that owes me but I can not collect money shortly as they is none here the times has been squally here and in the East as you are aware that many states drawed off from the union But I myself are death for the union and will die for it and though the south has susceeded it was not the voice of the fighting class. Rebecca wrote to you last month I have wrote constant and we can't here nothing from you since last July Jo I want to hear from you bad and don't fail to write direct your letter to The Store in the west post office Pike County Ark, I have Land plenty (appears to be consu) home and see I handle but little money. Scott(?) is wondering along they have 3-children. Rebeca is as big a fool about me as ever Clinton is a nice young man near as (the bottom of this page is missing)

I will now give you all our ages:

Jacob Putman born 13th March 1810 now 51 years old

Sarah your mother Born 21st December 1816 and died 8th October 1853 lived 36 years 9 months 17 days and lived 20 years with me.

Joseph Putman Born 22 June 1834&26 years old last June

Charles Putman born (appears to be 29th) December 1838 and died 19th November 1857 lived - 19 years lacking one month.

Rebeca Forester born 21 December 1836

Clinton Putman born 7th June 1846 will be 15 years old in June next

Dick Putman born 3 April 1849 - 12 years old

I want to try to school them Jo conduct yourself well & be of long patience and try particularly to please them you are (can't read it) trusty and honorable for your happiness all depends on it. I am study don't drink spirits of no kind Elijah drinks to his ruin I am always (can't read it) at something I take a great Interest in the farm. Sonny Davis & Jack & Bill Hawkins both married Brewster gals is all in the country also the Millers of Dade Ga. Peggy Miller has two children. I was at the granying of both I do all that Busi (the rest of the letter is missing)

This certainly helps with the birth dates. Don't you wish everyone was that considerate.

The children were:

JOSEPH PUTMAN born June 22, 1834 in Georgia. He was gone by the 1860 census of Pike County, Arkansas as he was not with his folks then. See the above mentioned letter, he was alive in 1861, but I cannot find him in any state anywhere in 1860 or later. I assume he

died in the Civil War.

REBECCA PUTMAN born December 21, 1836 in Georgia. She is gone in 1860, probably married. She married Scott Forester in Walker County, and they moved with her family to Sevier County and then Pike County, Arkansas. Their children were:

Edward Forester
Sarah Caroline Forester
Elijah Forester
Josephine Forester
Marianna Forester

CHARLES PUTMAN born December 29, 1838 in Georgia. He died November 19, 1857 at age nineteen.

CLINTON E. PUTMAN born June 7, 1846 in Georgia. I cannot find him after 1860.

RICHARD JACOB PUTMAN born April 3, 1849 in Georgia. He is living with Narcissa Patton in Pike County, Arkansas in 1860 at age eleven. He married Nancy Hamilton Hall. Jacob Putman born in 1891. He was home in 1910 and gone in 1920.

William was born in about 1816 to 1817 in Kentucky, probably in Warren County. I have seen his middle name as Jacob, but since Ezekiel has another son named Jacob, I'm just leaving it as J. He is in the 1850 census of De Kalb County Alabama living near his brother Jacob Putman. His wife was Martha Hampton, born 1821 in Georgia. They were married in Paulding County April 18, 1839. In 1850 they had four children.

In 1860 they were in De Kalb County and so was what seems to be his brother, David. In 1860 he has given up farming and is teaching.

William will die by 1870, when Martha appears as a widow in Walker County, Georgia with the three youngest children. In 1880, she was living with her son William, junior in Tarrant County, Texas. They moved there in about 1875. Martha died August 1, 1885 in Weatherford, Texas and was buried in Birdville, Texas.

The children of this marriage were:

MARY ANN PUTMAN born about 1840 in Georgia. She nursed her brother John Augustus back to health after he contracted 'slow fever' while serving for the Confederacy. Mary herself caught this fever and died of it around 1864.

Maude had died of pneumonia January 11, 1933 in Fort Smith, Arkansas. He was a wholesale grocer. The children were:

Augustus Junkin Putman born in Arkansas in March 1895. He married Margaret Adele Thornton on July 13, 1919 in Washington County. He was a newspaperman in Dallas. He died about 1955 in Dallas, Texas. They had one daughter, Susan.

Jesse Stanley Putman born in Arkansas in September 1897, and died in 1982. He lived all his life in Fort Smith. He ran a grocery store. He married Drusilla Junkin. John J. Putman born in June 1904. He married Margaret O'Byrne. They had a son, John Putman Jr. a senior editor of National Geographic Magazine.

Lydia Margaret Putman born December 18, 1907 and died July 5, 1983. She married Edward Martin Wallace. He was an artist and Minister. Children were: William Roger Wallace, Arthur Gray Wallace, Carolyn Wallace, Daniel Eugene Wallace, John Edward Wallace

James Grey Putman born March 8, 1914. He married a Mrs. Virginia Cole June 8, 1939. They were later divorced and he married a Dortha. The children, all in the first marriage were: **James Grey Putman Jr., David Putman.**

Joseph M. Putman born in Arkansas in 1870. He remained in Parker County, Texas and was there in 1900 with a wife named Manna Sanford born in Arkansas and one child. They were in Quay County, New Mexico in 1910 and 1920. Their only child was:

Mary E. Putman born in Texas in 1877. She was gone or married by 1900.

Mattie D. Putman born in Texas in June of 1880 and home in 1900. She married Theodore Ferguson. They had a son James.

JAMES G. PUTMAN born in 1844. He was home in 1850 and 1860. He married Margaret Tennessee Thurman, and was in Etowah County, Alabama in 1870. In 1880, they were in Greene County, Missouri. The 1880 listing lists him as Jas. G. By 1900, James had died and

Margaret and the children are in Parker County, Texas. Margaret is still there in 1910 and in 1920 she is in Los Angeles County, California at age 69 living with her son Frank. She was born in Tennessee in 1849. She is still there in 1930. Based on the census returns, the children were:

Charles W. Putman born in Georgia in January 1869. In 1900 he is in Parker County, Texas with his wife Laura Caruthers, born October 1871 in Texas, and one daughter. They were married September 15, 1891 in Parker County. In 1910, it seems they were divorced. Charles is in Haskell County, Oklahoma with a wife named Lizzie born in Illinois and no children. They are in Haskell County, Oklahoma in 1920 and 1930. Laura had moved in with her mother Mary Caruthers in Parker County and has their one daughter with her in 1910. She was still there in 1920, and in 1930 was in Fort Worth Texas living with her daughter Mary who was married then. Charlie was a farmer. The child was:

Mary Putman born in January 1892. She married Ernest Tucker from New Hampshire and they are in Fort Worth in 1930 and her mom is there too.

Frank Richard Putman born in Georgia April 27, 1873. He too is in Parker County in 1900 with a wife named Eva born in Texas in January 1875. Eva died around 1902. He then married Emma Idee Harrison on September 14, 1904. In 1920, they are in Los Angeles California, and his mother is with him. He was jeweler and moved to Hollywood. Their only child was:

WILLIAM JACOB PUTMAN, JR. born in February 1848. In 1870 he is 22 and living next door to his brother. He is with the family of Monroe and Mary Burch. In 1880 he is in Tarrant County, Texas with a wife Elizabeth Ann Farmer and they have two children. In 1900, he is in Eastland County, Texas with Elizabeth and three children. In 1910 he has died, and Betty Ann is Brown County, Texas living with her daughter Mollie. In 1920 she is in Coleman County, Texas, and living with her son Charles. Best I can determine, these are the children:

Charles B. (Bill or William) Putman born in 1877. In 1900 he is at home with his wife Emily Alice Strickland living with them. In 1910 and 1920 they are in Coleman

County. In 1920 his widowed mom Betty Ann is with him. He is in Mitchell County by 1930. Their children are:

William Dalton. Putman born in 1902 in Ranger, Eastland County Texas and died in November 1975. He married Frances Rogene Law and they were in Wichita, Texas in 1930.

Edgar Lee Putman born in 1904.

Bessie M. Putman born in 1907.

Charles B. 'Buster' Putman Jr. born in 1909.

Lillian A. Putman born in 1915.

Mary (Mollie) Putman born in 1879 and at home in 1900. She married Robert E. Owen.

Bruce Putman born September 12, 1881 and home in 1900. He is living with his brother Charles in 1910, and I don't find him in 1920.

JOSEPH WORTH PUTMAN born in 1850. At home with his mother in Walker County, Georgia in 1870. He then seems to have gone to Texas, probably with his brother William. He was in Fort Worth, Tarrant County, as he was married and having kids around 1880. I have a letter from one of his sons, Herbert, written to Rev. Bill Putman of Houston in 1969. He relates that his father was a school teacher and newspaperman writing under the name 'Slade' at the Fort Worth Gazette. At other times he edited papers in Quanah, Texas, Weatherford, Texas, Cheyenne, Oklahoma, Miles City, Montana, Eastland, Texas. This is all I have. Herbert gives this listing of sorts of the children. In going over the Texas census records, I can better piece together this family. In 1900 through 1930 there is a Nannie J. Putman born in Dec 1856 in Tennessee living in Fort Worth with these children. In 1900 her brother Wylie Neal is there as well. So we know Joe's wife is Nancy Jane Neal. It looks like they were married in the early 1880s and he died before 1900. That's why he never made any census reports. According to her tombstone in Halton, Tarrant County Texas, Nannie was born December 19, 1856 and died January 25, 1932. At any rate, the family was:

Mary Putman born in 1910.

MARTHA PUTMAN born in 1852. At home with her mom in Walker County, Georgia 1870. She married Robert Featherstone and they lived near Henrietta, Texas and ranched there.

ELIJAH PUTMAN born in October 1856. In Walker County, Georgia in 1870 with mom. He married Mary or Molly Self in Johnson County, Texas on April 24, 1879. In 1880 he is not in the Soundex as there were no children yet. 1900 he is listed in Parker County, Texas with Mary born in June 1865 in Texas. He was mayor of Weatherford, Parker County, Texas at one time according to a relative. At the time their children were:

Mark Putman born in Texas January 21, 1880. He was a car dealer and died in El Paso. In 1920, he is in Parker County with a wife named Georgia C. and in 1930 they are in El Paso. They had these children:

Elijah Putman born in 1901. He is married to Ruth Myers in El Paso in 1930.

They were married there in 1929.

George Putman born in 1903.

Addie Putman born in Texas in February 1884. She married a Bennington and lived in Fort Worth.

SARAH PUTMAN born in 1858.

David L. Putman

David was born in Anderson County (Pendleton District), South Carolina in 1818. This would have been on Ezekiel's stop over in his old home neck of the woods before heading to Hall County, Georgia.

Dave married Emily Tolbert in Marshall County, Alabama on July 27, 1841. He first appears in Census records in 1850 while living in Cherokee County, Alabama. At that time, there were three children.

He is in DeKalb County, Alabama with his brother William in the 1860 census of DeKalb County, Alabama. Other members of the family were there in 1850. In 1860, there are three daughters at home. I do not find him in 1870, and assume he was killed in the Civil War.

There is a land record for Homestead Land registered in Huntsville, Alabama on April 26, 1882. So, he was in Madison County in the 1880s, but I do not find him in the census data.

He married Mary Ann Brooke on September 28, 1847 in Cherokee County where a marriage record exists. She was born July 8, 1827 and died in Graham, Texas January 4, 1918. Her parents were John Prescott Brooke and Hester Bennett. Prescott was born in 1795 on board the ship Volunteer while traveling to America. Guess his birthplace was somewhere near the lost continent of Atlantis.

He is in Cherokee County, Georgia in the 1860 census with seven children. He is in Jackson County, Alabama in 1870 and in 1880 he is in Young County, Texas with Mary Ann and more kids. In 1900 he is still in Young County, Texas at age 73 with Mary Ann 72 and no more kids at home. Abe has died by 1910 and Mary Ann is then 82 and living with her daughter Julia Timmons in Young County.
