

EZEKIEL PUTMAN

Ezekiel Putman seems to be the youngest son of Barnet and Sarah Putman, being born probably in Union County, South Carolina in the early 1770s.

Ezekiel married Hannah Brazelton in 1800 in Anderson, South Carolina. Hannah was the daughter of Jacob Brazelton and Hannah Green of Granville County, North Carolina.

I am not certain where he and Hannah were married, but they appeared in the 1800-1810 Census in the Pendleton District of South Carolina.

In the early 1800s, Ezekiel moved with other members of his family to Warren County, Kentucky.

Sometime in 1817, Ezekiel moved his family to Hall County, Georgia for the final time. This time, his brother, Thomas and his family went with them.

Hannah died in 1833 and was buried in the Hopewell Baptist Church Cemetery in Cass County, Georgia. Cass County's name was changed to Bartow County in 1861. The records show that Ezekiel was married a second time to Sarah Hestalye on June 9, 1835. Ezekiel spent the rest of his life in Georgia and died there in 1845.

Briefly his children were:

Elias Putman

Elias Putman was born about 1801. I find his wife listed as Libby (born 1813 in North Carolina) in the 1850 census. I believe her name was Arletha, as that is what she used in 1880.

In 1850 they were in Floyd County, Georgia, in 1860 in neighboring Gordon County, Georgia. In 1870 several of the children are in Gordon County, Georgia. I assume Elias died sometime in the 1860s.

Daniel Putman

Daniel Putman was born in about 1802-1803. He married Nancy McConnell in Hall County on September 8, 1825. They lived in Cherokee County, Georgia at the time of the 1850 census through 1870. In 1880 Nancy had died and Daniel is living with his son James and is 78 at that time. He must have died in the 1880s as I do not find him again.

Sarah Putman

Sarah Putman was born about 1803-1804. She married James McConnell in Hall County on December 11, 1823. I have nothing more.

Rebecca Putman

Rebecca was born about 1804 and she married Henry B. Cobb in Hall County on November 18, 1824.

Jacob Putman

Jacob was born about 1807 and he married Sarah H. Johnston in Hall County on February 28, 1833. He and his family were in Walker County, Georgia in the 1840 census along with Sarah and the eldest three of their children. In the 1850 census of DeKalb County, Alabama, he is shown with Sarah and six children.

Simeon Putman

There is a tombstone in Hall County next to Hannah Putman's. It states Simeon was born December 1, 1808 and died October 10, 1826.

Thomas Putman

Thomas, born about 1813, married Lucinda Hurt on October 6, 1844 and was listed in the 1850 Cass County, Georgia Census. He was listed as a blacksmith.

He had three children in the 1850 census and in 1870 was in Bartow County, Georgia with Lucinda and six children.

Abraham Pickney Putman

Abraham Pickney Putman was born in March, 1827 in Cherokee County, Georgia. He married Mary Ann Brooke on September 28, 1847 in Cherokee County where a marriage record exists. She was born in July 1827.

He is in Cherokee County, Georgia in the 1860 census with seven children. In 1880 he is in Young County, Texas with Mary Ann and more kids. In 1900 he is still in Young County, Texas at age 73 with Mary Ann 72 and no more kids at home.

James Putman

James was born in 1824 or 1825. I am placing him here only based on the 1860 census of Floyd County, Georgia. At that time he was 35, his wife Lucy Ann was 35.

Elijah M. Putman

In the 1860 Floyd County census, he was 27 and his wife Charlotte Earle was 25 from South Carolina. In 1870 Charlotte, then 36, was a widow and living with her parents, Baylis and Mary Earle in Floyd County, Georgia.

Richard G. Putman

Richard was born about 1839 according to the 1860 census of Floyd County. His wife Catherine was born in North Carolina in 1838.

There is a marriage record in Floyd County, Georgia where Richard Putman married Catherine C. Johnson on September 23, 1858.

In 1870 they were still in Floyd County and had two sons.

Mary Putman

She was born in about 1840 and was living with her brother Richard in 1860. She was not at home in the 1870 census and had probably married by then.
