

# DICKINSON PUTMAN of HARRIS COUNTY

I am listing Dickinson as I have absolutely no idea who he relates to.

He pops up in Texas records in 1838. He received 960 acres in Harris County for war service (Bounty Warrant 1470) on January 1, 1838. The service was in the Texas War of Independence and he served from January 12, 1836 till October 4, 1836. He was carried on the muster rolls under Captain Reuben Ross' Houston Volunteer Guards.

In 1837, he is listed as a debtor in the will of Merriweather Woodson Smith. Smith came from Roane County, Tennessee. Simeon Putman was in Roane County in 1830, but I so far can account for all his sons.

On August 30, 1845, the land awarded Dickinson was 'patented to his heirs". Looks like he died by then.

I don't find any reference to him in the 1840, or to any Putman heirs in 1850.

I know he existed, but that's about it.
